Company and university visits are typically scheduled one to four months prior to program start date. As a result, our proposal may include a few placeholders for unspecified visits. Each will be specified in the months leading up to May 2019, and this process will be completed in close collaboration with Virginia Tech faculty leaders. ### Day 6 | Friday, May 24 (Madrid to Granada, via Toledo)

Morning Check out and travel to Toledo (~1 hour); guided tour of the city architecture

Toledo was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO for its extensive monumental and cultural heritage. Toledo is known as the "Imperial City" for having been the main venue of the court of Charles V, Holy Roman Emperor, and as the "City of the Three Cultures" for the cultural influences of Christians,

Muslims, and Jews reflected in its history.

Afternoon Small group lunches on your own. Engage in reflection while continuing on to

Granada; check into your hotel

Evening Group dinner followed by a traditional flamenco performance at a theater built

into a cave!

### Day 7 | Saturday, May 25 (Granada)

Morning Guided architecture-focused visit to La Alhambra and El Generalife

Completed towards the end of Muslim rule in Spain, the Alhambra palace and fortress complex is a reflection of the last centuries of Moorish culture. Become

enchanted by its lush gardens, ornate carvings, and unique architecture.

Afternoon Group lunch then visit Mirador de San Nicolas for panoramic views of Granada

This is the largest mosque in Morocco, and was designed by the French architect Michel Pinseau. It is situated on a promontory looking out to the Atlantic Ocean, which can be seen through a gigantic glass floor with room for

25,000 worshippers.
