**Application for RSAP 2019** DEADLINE: Saturday, September 29, 2018 at 11:59 pm

The Rising Sophomore Abroad Program (RSAP) is a study abroad opportunity for engineering and science students at the end of their first year. The program has two components: a spring semester course and one to two weeks of international travel.

Accepted students must register for the course ENGE 1644 (Global STEM Practice: Leadership and Culture). It will meet twice weekly during the Spring 2019 semester. The course is designed to introduce students to global engineering and science practices, emphasize the importance of cultural competency for engineers and scientists, and focus on how differences in cultural, social and economic contexts influence engineering and science work.

The program then culminates with travel to one of eight two-week international tracks. Travel will take place very shortly after Spring 2019 final exams. Below is the the list of the eight tracks offered for RSAP 2019 with their <u>tentative</u> costs (subject to change). Cost of the program varies by international track. You will be asked to rank your preference for these tracks in this application.

- 1. Italy, Switzerland, Austria, and Germany (\$4300)
- 2. China (\$4300)
- 3. Spain and Morocco (\$4000)
- 4. United Kingdom and Ireland (\$4000)
- 5. Australia and New Zealand (\$4500)
- 6. Chile and Argentina (\$4000)
- 7. Ecuador and Peru (\$4000)
- 8. South Africa (\$4300)

Costs include the program fee, airfare, lodging, in-country transportation, company visits, admission fees to major attractions, guided tours, and some group meals (see program descriptions for more details on what is included for each track). Not included in this fee is the cost of most lunches and dinners and personal expenses.

Financial support is available to students on the basis of financial need. Applicants will be considered for such financial support at a later date, so we encourage you to apply.
